National World War I Museum at Liberty Memorial Names Kathleen Brady as Vice President of Development

The National World War I Museum at Liberty Memorial is pleased to announce the appointment of Kathleen Brady as its Vice President of Development.

Brady, who comes from more than a decade of fundraising experience at the University of Kansas, will be in charge of expanding the Museum's fundraising efforts which includes individual giving, sponsorships and corporate / foundation contributions, along with the annual fundraising campaign.

"We are able to fulfill the mission of the National World War I Museum because of the generosity of our benefactors. Kathleen's role is vital as we seek new partners to reach the full extent of the Museum's potential," said Brian Alexander, National World War I Museum President & CEO.

More than forty percent of the not-for-profit Museum's annual \$5 million operating budget comes from donations and contributions. Donations are tax deductible.

"It is vital that current and future generations have an understanding of events surrounding the war which this Museum provides unlike any other place. I look forward to visiting with those who want to support our efforts," Brady said.

While at KU Endowment, Brady led fundraising efforts for the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and raised \$1 million for the School of Education's first endowed professorship. She earned an undergraduate degree and a master of public administration degree from KU.

The Museum opened in 2006 and is the only one in America dedicated solely to World War I. It houses a world-class collection of more than 55,000 objects and a research center with numerous original documents related to the war.
