6. Name a WWI Ace that had 72 victories. For whom did he fight?

WEST GALLERY:

7. Find an artifact that honors Theodore Roosevelt's son Quentin. What is this artifact and why was it made?
8. How many German soldiers were fighting on the Western Front in fall 1918?

9. Abercrombie and Fitch played an important role in WWI. What did the company do?

11. Who was John F. Herbst? What is special about his service in the war?

10. Especially useful in delivering critical messages, 20,000 of these were shipped to Europe by the U.S. What were these?

12. What does it mean to be a Gold Star mother?
