Online Collections Database, <"object ID">, <a href="www.theworldwar.org/explore/online-collections-database">www.theworldwar.org/explore/online-collections-database</a>. National WWI Museum and Memorial. Online. Accessed <Access date>.

• The Object ID is the official listing for the object in the Online Collections Database and can be found as the first thing on any object's page.

## Finding a Direct Link:

The URL at the top of the page will not directly take someone to that object. To get a direct link, you will need to click on the "Create Shareable URL" button.
